

BE PREPARED:

PROACTIVE

Don't wait for an accident. Be on the lookout for unsafe conditions or actions by others.

RESPONSIBLE

Follow all rules for the event and individual activities.

EMPATHETIC

Think about the safety of everyone attending ScoutFest 2020. Speak-up and politely correct anyone who is doing something unsafe.

PATIENT

Rushing leads to mistakes and injuries. Never take shortcuts on safety!

ALERT

Focus on the activity and don't allow yourself to be distracted from your task. Be on the lookout for hazards.

READY

Know what to do if there is an emergency.

EDUCATED

Make sure you are familiar with all safety rules for the activity. If you feel uncomfortable or unsure, please ask a leader!

DEPART

Leave the activity with a positive experience – Go home safe!

SAFETY & SECURITY

Our First Priority

To provide a safe environment for our guests and volunteers, and their possessions, the ScoutFest 2020 Committee is partnering with local Police Departments (St. Louis City & St. Louis County), the Missouri Highway Patrol, the St. Louis Fire Department, Forest Park Rangers, EMS, Private Security, and others. Security officials will have a very visible presence around the clock the entire weekend, securing parking sites, program areas, camping areas, and access points around the perimeter of Forest Park. We will be monitoring activity in the park, and a plan is in place to effectively communicate incidents and concerns to security personnel on site.

As in any setting, participants should always practice situational awareness and report hazards or suspicious activities to a leader or public safety official.

In order to guarantee your spot with your district, you must register by August 15th. Day participants are welcome to register until the event, but the price increases by \$10 after July 15th.

Event price will be the same for both day and overnight campers. Why is the cost the same? The cost to develop the weekend is primarily focused on the Saturday Program, the Evening Show, and the infrastructure; which results in Friday and Sunday being a bonus for our guests. Event registration allows you full access to ScoutFest.

Leadership Requirements

Per the National standard of the BSA, there must be at least 2 adults per 8 youth. Two-Deep leadership must always be exercised unless it is a parent with their children. There must be at least one female leader present when camping with female youth and youth with more than two years of age difference may not sleep in the same tent. Please adhere to all Youth Protection Guidelines.

HOW TO GET TO SCOUTFEST

There will be parking off-site with transportation to and from the event. 24 hour security will be provided for all designated off-site parking areas.

Parking in the park will be extremely limited.

Please carpool, pack lightly, and plan to use public transportation when possible or have someone drop off as many participants as possible.

Do not plan to access your car over the weekend. You'll be having too much fun to do so anyways!

Unit trailers will be parked away from the campsites in a secure location. Do not plan to access your unit trailer after unloading during the weekend.

How to Check In at ScoutFest

CHECK IN PROCEDURES FOR OVERNIGHT CAMPERS

When you arrive



Check In: Check in at your District headquarters after 3 pm Friday. Please do not arrive earlier. The District Campmaster will assign your unit a campsite. All units will camp with their district. List of Campmasters can be found on page 22.

Official Friday Arrival Plans, including authorized points of entry into the Park and routes to assigned Camping areas will be published prior to the event. We ask that everyone arriving to camp or drop off youth on Friday to please closely follow the official Friday Arrival Plans.



- Please provide two copies of your roster showing the names of participants in alphabetical order, divided by adult and youth members.
- Everyone must have BSA Health forms A & B leaders and parents should hold onto child(ren)'s medical forms.
- Also provide a cell phone number for a leader in your Unit in case of emergencies.

Check Out: Each District will determine the exact method for dismissal and will convey that information at the Leaders Meeting on Friday evening. No Unit may leave until checked out by a member of the District staff. All units should be checked out from camping areas by 2 p.m. on Sunday.



CHECK IN PROCEDURES FOR VENTURERS & OUT OF COUNCIL UNITS

Check In: Venturers will camp in a designated Venturing Campsite. Venturers and adult leaders of Venturers will check in at that campsite. GSLAC Venturing units/members will have the option to camp within their District camping area. Please inform your District Campmaster to make final arrangements. Out of Council units will have their own campsite. Out of Council units will check in at the out of council campsite, a member of the event staff will be in contact to communicate all information.



CHECK IN PROCEDURES FOR DAY VISITORS

Check In: Registration packets that include event wristbands and parking instructions will be available at check-in/registration stations throughout the park (exact locations TBD). Parking instructions will be released two months or so before the event.

CAMPING INFORMATION



Camping will be with your unit and your unit will be with your district. Each district will have a headquarters. You will check in on Friday after 3PM at your District Headquarters. You will check out on Sunday by 2PM at your District Headquarters.

Out of Council units will camp in a designated out of council campsite. Venturers will camp in a designated Venturing campsite. Each of those campsites will have their own HQ.

Where will the headquarters be? You will receive a map in advance of the weekend with clear information on how to get into the park, where you will be camping, and where your District Headquarters will be. Your district will have a Campmaster who will oversee your entire district. Questions before the event may be directed to your District Campmaster. See page 22 for your Campmaster.

Camping Dos and Don'ts

CAMPING IN FOREST PARK IS A PRIVILEGE.

ALL PARTICIPANTS <u>MUST</u> FOLLOW THE GUIDELINES BELOW AND TREAT THE PARK AND OTHER CAMPERS WITH RESPECT.

- 1. Follow Scout Oath and Law A Scout is Courteous
- 2. Attend your District's Roundtable to obtain the latest information
- 3. Be PREPARED to walk. Closed-toed, walking shoes required
- 4. You will be camping as a unit within your District
- 5. Be MINIMALISTIC your trailer will not be close to your campsite
- 6. All camping gear will be unloaded and the trailer moved to a secure location do not count on it being readily available
- 7. Under no circumstances should anyone drive on the grass
- 8. All equipment and materials will have to be carried to and from your campsite
- 9. Latrine facilities will be provided (Porta Johns) but no shower facilities available.
- 10. Water will be available count on needing to hike to and from your water source
- 11. Leave No Trace trash and recycling collection areas will be available
- 12. NO gray water should be dumped on the grass. Solids should be strained out and gray water dumped down the street inlets.
- 13. Maps will be available in advance of the weekend through your District Campmaster (your main point of contact)
- 14. All tents/dining flies over 800 SQFT must be permitted by the City of St. Louis Building Division
- 15. Curfew is 11PM each night
- 16. Tent stakes cannot be longer than 10 inches; consider using sandbags/weighted pales



CAMPING INFORMATION CONT.



Food is not included as part of your registration for the event. Please make arrangements with your Unit for meals throughout the weekend. Some Districts may offer a food plan to be served at their District headquarters; check with your District leadership to learn whether this option is available to you.

Outside food vendors will be available on site at various times and locations if you would like to supplement some of your meals. The Council is not involved with the pricing and available quantities for these vendors, so please keep this in mind when planning your meals. Potable water spouts from designated fire hydrants will be available as well as a water buffalo near camping areas. Exact locations will be published on the final map. Bottled water and ice will be available for purchase at the Trading Post in limited quantities.

No ground fires will be allowed. Small propane/camp stoves will be allowed and small Weber-type grills, but no large BBQ pits. Up to 20 pound propane tanks are allowed at the event, as long as they are secured from tipping over. Per the City Ordinance 70932, section 2, recreational fires may not be located within 25 ft of any structure including a fence or deck. Recreational fires must be extinguished within 4 hours and no fire allowed if winds exceed 15 MPH.

Sample Unit Meals

KEEP MEALS SIMPLE AND WELL-PLANNED BEFORE THE WEEKEND.

PLAN TO HAVE A PORTABLE LUNCH SATURDAY.

Friday Dinner: plan to eat off-site before entering the park or plan to eat at one of the Forest Park Institutions (the Boathouse, History Museum, Science Center, the Zoo, Art Museum- details to follow)

<u>Saturday Breakfast:</u> yogurt, fruit, pastries (consider distributing lunch at breakfast so that Scouts don't have to come back to the campsite)

Saturday Lunch: grab-and-go, pre-packaged lunch sacks with sandwiches, chips, fruit and a drink

Saturday Dinner: simple, already prepared camp meals to be re-heated on individual camp stove, freeze dried camp meals, sandwiches, designate a parent/helper to bring in pizza for the unit, etc. (remember access to the park will be limited, plan ahead)

<u>Snacks:</u> make sure to have snacks (that do not need to be prepared) readily available for all Scouts

Recycling & Trash Collection

LEAVE NO TRACE.

There will be ample designated places to dispose of trash and recycling. At this event we will have receptacles for trash, aluminum and cardboard. Please limit use of plastics and do NOT bring any glass.

No gray water should be dumped on the grass. Solids should be strained out and gray water dumped down the street inlets.

You may have to hike to dispose of trash. Please plan accordingly. There will also be designated spots for ash and grease waste disposal.

How to get to The Grand Basin Show on Saturday Night at Art Hill

EACH DISTRICT WILL LEAVE AT A DESIGNATED TIME

Attendees will travel by foot to Art Hill for The Grand Basin Show on Saturday evening.

- Units will meet as a District and travel as a group at designated planned time
- Utilize your unit flag to keep the group together
- Districts will enter in one of four locations around Art Hill
- Districts will sit together. Units will return to their District camping area as a District following the show
- Those with disabilities will be accommodated, please inform your campmaster of such requests

Camping Locations

Your camping location will be based on your unit's district. There will be separate camping areas available for Venturing Crews and Out-of-Council units. Exact camping locations for each district will be assigned and communicated in advance of the weekend. List of Campmasters can be found on page 22.

CAMPING INFORMATION CONT.



BE CAUTIOUS AND PREPARED.

Unit leaders should be prepared to administer basic first aid for cuts and bruises just like any other weekend camp-out.

All attendees should have a BSA medical form A & B with them or with their unit leader. It is not advised for young children to have their own medical forms on them, but close by with a unit leader or parent.

For more concerning situations, first aid stations will be located throughout the park. The first aid stations will be partnered with Mercy Hospitals and feature highly trained medical personnel. EMS will be located on-site for the duration of the weekend.

Items to bring & NOT to bring

PACK THOUGHTFULLY.

With such a large event, it is vital to pack minimally but make sure to bring the following items: **BRING:**

- Closed-Toed, Walking Shoes
- Re-Usable Water Bottle
- Flashlights
- Sunscreen
- Rain Gear (activities will be rain or shine!)
- BSA Health Forms A & B
- Any necessary medications

DO NOT BRING:

- Alcohol or Drugs
- Fireworks
- Personal Generators
- Bikes, skateboards, ATVs
- Drones
- Firearms
- Pets

Historic average weekend indicates a and a low of 52 degrees.

Be sure to check the weather before packing and make sure to minimize the need for electronics as there will be no place to plug in chargers, etc.

REFUND POLICY

ScoutFest 2020 fees are refunded only under extenuating circumstances or severe medical emergencies. If a refund is sought, the refund request form must be filled out and submitted to the camping department at camping@stlbsa.org by October 7, 2020 for consideration. Refund request forms can be found on the ScoutFest 2020 website: www.scoutfest2020.com/register.

In the unlikely event that ScoutFest has to be postponed until 2021 due to COVID-19, all registrations will be transferred to 2021 or refunded in full.



WEATHER POLICY



ScoutFest 2020 will take place rain or shine.

We will monitor the weather throughout the course of the weekend and work with public emergency personnel to ensure safety. In case of extreme inclement weather, communication will be pushed out to all guests in a timely manner Updates will be published to our social media channels, the ScoutFest 2020 App, and the ScoutFest 2020 website.

Due to the significant event expenses that will be incurred before the event, attendees should not expect their registration fees to be refunded as a result of any weather situation.


